## AGE GROUP(S) & CATEGORIES

35 years of age or older (Born in 1984 or earlier)

16 female teams & 16 male teams  
(Minimum roster 3 players; maximum of 4)

## ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY & AFFILIATION

Athletes must meet the age requirements set out in this technical package. The competition is sanctioned by the Alberta Basketball Association.

Athletes participating in the Alberta Masters Games must be registered members of the Alberta Basketball Association for insurance purposes. For information on ABA affiliation and current fees, check out [www.abbasketball.ca](http://www.abbasketball.ca)

The Alberta Masters Games are open to residents of Alberta.

## EVENT(S)

Alberta Masters Games will use the FIBA 3X3 rules of play with adjustments that have been adopted by the NSO/PSO as deemed suitable for this development phase in the 2019 competition year.

The official ball for FIBA 3X3 basketball is Wilson (size 6 – intermediate ball – with the weight of a size 7 official ball)

If 16 teams participate, the format will be 4 pools of 4 teams.

If 12 teams participate, the format will be 4 pools of 3 teams.

If 8 teams participate, the format will be 2 pools of 4 teams.

Fill team(s) may be added to even out division play, where necessary. Fill team(s) will be chosen at the discretion of the Alberta Masters Games.

Seeding will be determined by a random draw based on the results of the FIBA Event Maker.

All games played to 21 points until a winner is declared as per endorsed rules of FIBA 3X3. Points are awarded - 1 point for baskets made inside the arc, 2 points are awarded for baskets made from outside the arc.

The FIBA Event system will automatically calculate placements based on inputted results.

Tie-breaking in Pool Standings – Two (2) teams: In the event that two teams have the same number of points after round robin play in the standings, the classification will be estab-

lished by taking into account only the result of the game between the two teams involved, with the winner receiving the higher placing.

Tie-breaking in Pool Standings – More than two (2) teams: If more than two teams have equal points in the standings (based on win-loss records), a second classification will be established taking into account only the results of all games between the teams involved.

If the situation is not resolved and teams have equal points in the placing after the second classification, then total points scored (points for) from all matches from pool play will be made to determine the final standings.

### **PROTEST PROCEDURES**

Protests will NOT be allowed within the field of play.

### **COMPETITIVE UNIFORM**

As per the endorsed rules of Canada Basketball, each team will be required to have a 'Home' and 'Away' set of t-shirts or jerseys – teams are required to supply their own set of matching uniforms. The designated 'home team' shall wear the lighter colour.

### **ALBERTA MASTERS GAMES REGISTRATION FEE/SPORT REGISTRATION FEE**

An Alberta Sport Connection Games registration fee of \$35 per person will be charged, and a Host Society Sport fee of \$15 will be levied on all participants who register for the 2019 Alberta Masters Games.
