Alberta Summer Games wrap-up in Grande Prairie

Grande Prairie, AB – The Alberta Summer Games, a province-wide summer sports competition for Albertans 11-17 years of age, came to a close on July 22. More than 2,800 participants from throughout Alberta attended the 20 sport, four-day competition.

“I am so proud of our amazing young athletes and the competition, sportsmanship and comradery on display over the last four days in Grande Prairie demonstrated once again that Alberta produces some of the best athletes in Canada,” said Ricardo Miranda, Minister of Culture and Tourism. “Congratulations to all the athletes who participated in the 2018 Alberta Summer Games, and thank you to the organizers, volunteers and the City and County of Grande Prairie for their amazing hospitality.”

Minister’s Cup: Zone showing the greatest improvement from one Alberta Games to the next: Zone 5 (Yellowhead Black Gold);

Spirit of Sport Award: Zone best demonstrating the spirit of fair play, sportsmanship, team spirit and cooperation on and off the field of play: Zone 8 (Peace Country).
